Course Title: Preparatory Arabic Language Course

Course Code: AL 99

Level: Beginner

Course Description:

AL 99 introduces students to essential morphological skills and foundational elements of Arabic grammar. Students will learn the correct way to write Alif Layenah (الألف اللينة) at the end of words and to recognize correct verb forms based on soundness and irregularity. Additionally, the course covers key orthographic rules, including the distinction between Hamzat Al-Wasl and Hamzat Al-Qat' (همزة الوصل و همزة القطع) and their grammatical functions. Students will acquire these skills through reading and analyzing a variety of literary texts across genres and historical periods.

Target Audience: First-year university students.

Learning Objectives:

- 1. Understand literary texts.
- 2. Develop a general knowledge of texts across different literary historical periods.
- 3. Analyze and appreciate literary texts.
- 4. Use Arabic dictionaries to identify unfamiliar vocabulary.
- 5. Distinguish between hamzat al-wasl and hamzat al-qat', both in pronunciation and writing.
- 6. Correctly apply spelling rules, such as writing *hamza* at the beginning, middle, and end of words, and accurately writing *alif Layenah*.
- 7. Master basic morphological skills, including identifying and correctly writing sound and weak verbs.
- 8. Recognize present tense verbs in various grammatical forms.
- 9. Develop a love for the Arabic language, appreciation of literary texts, respect for grammatical rules, and apply these values in daily practice.

Course Duration: One full semester (3 hours per week)

Teaching Method: Blended Learning. Students will attend two in-person sessions and one asynchronous activity per week via the e-learning platform.

Acquired Skills:

- Reading proficiency
- Correct writing, spelling (correct use of hamzat al-wasl and hamzat al-qat', alif Layenah, taa marbootah, haa, and taa maftoohah), and sentence construction with nominal and verbal structure

- Accurate grammar, including the use of grammatical case endings, as well as sentence and paragraph construction
- Textual analysis and verbal expression

After Course Completion: Upon completion, students are eligible to pursue any academic specialization. Students interested in careers listed below should continue in the field of Arabic language.
